Tell Them From Me Survey

Students in Yr4/5/6 completed the survey last term. There were five students who participated in the survey therefore with a small cohort the results are almost individual opinions. There were three overall areas the students were asked about. The results in each area are as follows:

- 100% of students have a positive attitude to expectations of success.
- 100% of students have a sense of belonging to our school community.
- 80% of students have a positive attitude to advocacy at school.

Staff will discuss these survey results at the next staff meeting and consider how our current Strategic Improvement Plan can improve advocacy at our school.
